

All of these valuables and documents will be restored subsequently.

For health reasons and out of a sense of propriety, I arranged for the bodies to be conveyed to the Institute of Forensic Medicine. The more detailed findings from there will be the subject of a separate report. (My initial report and the clothing accompanied the bodies).

OTHER MATTERS (PRESERVATION OF EVIDENCE)

My investigations at the scene having been concluded at 0500hrs, I was handed by officers of the Public Safety Department of the Police various items and valuables which were collated by the first officers on the scene, the detailed inventory of which is as follows

- One Jaeger-Lecoultrre watch in yellow metal, with white stones set in the dial;
- One broken bracelet, with six rows of white pearls and a dragon-shaped clasp made of brilliants;
- One yellow metal ring with white stones set into it;
- One yellow metal earring;
- One pair of women's shoes, with pointed toes, black, made by Versace, size 40;
- One ladies' black leather belt, made by Ralph Lauren, size 30, with some damage;
- **One Motorola Startac mobile phone, no. [REDACTED], the phone contained a telephone card.**

All of this property appears to belong to the Princess of Wales.

- One Cartier watch, rectangular, in white metal, with a window dial, no. 053/150, with a dark red crocodile skin type strap. This watch shows "3" and "55/60";
- One Breitling chronograph watch case, in working order, no. 59 028, this piece does not have a bracelet;
- One articulated white metal bracelet, with the name Breitling on its clasp;
- One Citizen watch case, not working, stuck at 12 or 00hrs, number 44 01 35. This piece does not have a bracelet.
- One fawn coloured cigar box, made by Savilinni, containing one cigar without a band;
- One cigar cutter in yellow metal, made by Asprey;
- **One Hutchinson Telecoms pager, with a blue DYMO strip containing the inscriptions and calling code : [REDACTED];**
- One organiser style address book, with a black leather cover, containing addresses in the United Kingdom, together with handwritten entries in English. There was also a Visa payment receipt in the name of Mr Trevor Rees Johns [sic];
- One blue Bic lighter;
- One set of six keys with a "Canal +" key ring.

All of these items will be restored following identification of the owners.
