

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION OF THE BODY

The body is that of a middle aged man, bearing a label worded as follows : height 1m72, weight 73kg, Institute of Forensic Medicine Paris no. 2147.

It is identified as being that of Henri PAUL.

The body is not putrefied.

Posterior lividity is not pronounced.

There is little [cadaveric] rigidity.

From an external examination, we can see multiple trauma injuries :

On the face :

- in the area of the forehead there is a frontal left haematoma with multiple abrasions and small linear erosions up to the left superciliary arch, with two wounds 5cm and 2cm in length at the level of the upper part of the eyelid at its outer edge extending in the case of one of them in a gash to the eyelid;
- multiple erosions to the right upper frontal [forehead] region;
- small erosions to the upper right cheekbone and to the lower part of the cheek to the right of and level with the chin, with a small wound at this point;

On the thorax :

- there is not a marked appearance of injuries, but two longitudinal cuts can be seen to the lower part of the thorax, and an ecchymosis to the upper left abdomen.
- The penis has an ecchymotic aspect and to the testicular region there is a wound on the left with the left testicle protruding externally.
