

Proceeding with my investigations, I found in a blue cloth Chapak rucksack on the ground in the hall:

- a Canon EOS-1 RS camera number 97115, with no film in it, fitted with a grey Canon lens EF 300 mm L Ultrasonic zoom lens. The small part of the lens had a piece of black adhesive tape around it;

- a silver metal Contax T VS Kyocera Japan camera number 013830, with no film in it.

When questioned about the cameras, Oderkerken, still under oath, stated:

"Those are my cameras. I used the big Canon in the daytime on the Saturday, the day the tragedy happened, and the small Contax on the night of the tragedy to take photos in the tunnel".

I SEIZED the Canon camera and its lens as described above AND PLACED THEM UNDER SEAL .

I SEIZED the Contax camera as described above AND PLACED IT UNDER SEAL.

Continuing my search, I found, also on the ground in the entrance hall, a black cloth Libre Cours rucksack containing:

- a Canon EOS-1 camera with no film in it, number 114060, fitted with a Canon Image Stabilizer Canon Lens EF 300 mm 1:4 L IS zoom lens protected by a blue cloth Sponking Size Case Nomadic Inc cover;

- a black leather case with the Canon logo containing a Canon Speedlite 540EZ flash, number 010901.

When questioned about the camera, Oderkerken, still under oath, stated:

"This camera and flash belong to Fabrice Chassery, He used them on Saturday to follow Diana and Dodi".

I SEIZED the Canon camera as described above AND PLACED IT UNDER SEAL.

I SEIZED the Canon flash as described above AND PLACED IT UNDER SEAL.

Since the remainder of the operation did not bring to light any objects or effects that appeared to be relevant to the case, I left the premises at 10.15.

Having read the statement himself, Mr Oderkerken signed it together with myself as a true record.
