

ITEMS 32.4; Flaws in the toxicology tests carried out by Dr Pépin

In relation to the analytical results of Dr Pépin we agree with the facts as set out in Section 34.4, subsections (a) and (b). We suggest that any conclusions to be drawn from these facts are matters for the court.

With respect to Section 34.4, subsections (c), we are all agreed that the explanation offered by Dr Pépin and Professor LeCompte, together, for carboxyhaemoglobin concentrations in the blood samples is implausible and can be discounted.

ITEMS 34; Tiapride results

We are agreed that tiapride was present in the samples of hair and urine analysed by Dr Pépin. However, the concentration of tiapride in the two blood samples analysed were less than 1% of the concentrations that would be seen during normal therapy. We note that no tiapride was detected in the stomach contents or tissues analysed by Dr Pépin.

OTHER AGREED ISSUES

Testing of the blood of DPOW recovered from the interior carpet of the Mercedes





We are agreed that Professor Cowan's report on the analysis of human chorionic gonadotropin (hCG) and levonorgestrel on the blood recovered from the interior carpet of the Mercedes does not exclude, in and of itself, the possibility that DPOW was pregnant at the time the blood identified as being hers was shed. If a positive result for hCG had been obtained this would have confirmed pregnancy.

Toxicology results from Dr Susan Paterson

The toxicology analysis carried out on the samples obtained at the UK post-mortem from DPOW and DA-F gave rise to no positive findings that contributed to the medical cause of death of either individual.

We believe that this report fairly characterises the extent to which the signatories of this report can agree over the issues identified as matters of concern by those properly interested persons who have expressed opinions. We are willing to explore further any further areas within our expertise that may give rise to concern to any of the properly interested persons on the direction of the Coroner provided sufficient time is made available for us to do so.
